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NPs salaries increased in 2010

Full-time nurse practitioners earned an average of \$90,770 last year, up from \$81,397 in 2007 and \$89,579 in 2009, according to the National Salary Survey of Nurse Practitioners. The average annual pay for fulltime NPs has increased by more than \$25,000 since 2001, the survey found.

Change in WA Notifiable Diseases Rules

Washington's notifiable conditions rule, Chapter 246-101 WAC has been revised and was adopted by the State Board of Health. The changes were effective February 4, 2011. This rule revision process involved making updates necessary to address new conditions and new laboratory methods. The final revised rule language is available at

http://www.doh.wa.gov/Rules/adoptedrules.htm. The Communicable Diseases Epidemiology Section of the WA Department of Health is coordinating communications regarding rule change. We will be publishing additional information and guidance via the following sources:

The following is a summary of key changes made:

For health care providers and facilities, a few notifiable conditions have been added (prion disease, labconfirmed influenza-associated death, and varicellaassociated death). Two conditions have been removed (typus and hemolytic uremic syndrome, to be addressed by reporting of shiga-toxin producing E. coli). Rare diseases that must be reported immediately are listed individually (e.g. anthrax, Burkholderia, smallpox, etc).

For clinical laboratories, the list of notifiable conditions is now consistent with the list of notifiable conditions for health care providers and facilities. Some specimen submission requirements have been added (most notably, any available cultures of pertussis, Listeria, and Cryptococcus other than known v. neoformans). While not part of the rule revisions, the public health laboratories would like to remind clinical laboratories that specimen labels and forms must include two identifiers: patient name AND a second identifier, e.g. date of birth.

Reporting timeframes have been modified. A new category, reportable within 24 hours, was created, and some conditions have been shifted from immediate reporting and 3 business days reporting. The system for locating reported cases has been improved. The revisions to the rule specify that health care providers and facilities must provide patient identifying information, including at least zip code of residence, to clinical laboratories when ordering lab tests for a notifiable condition. By January 1, 2013, laboratories must have databases capable of storing and retrieving this information.

UW Palliative Care Program Headed by DNP

Even under the best of circumstances, seriously ill patients too often lack timely access to palliative care -relief from the pain and suffering associated with serious disease. Studies show that doctors often wait to talk about palliative care until the patient's last few weeks or days of life. For vulnerable populations, like those without insurance, non-English speakers, or people without a primary-care doctor, conversations about palliative care happen even less frequently.

A new UW Medicine program based at Harborview Medical Center, however, is working to address such disparities in palliative care, armed with a \$100,000 grant from The Regence Foundation, the corporate Foundation of Regence BlueShield. The goal of the Primary Palliative Care Program, which started in 2009, is to improve continuity and quality of care for terminally ill patients who lack a primary care provider. The program will use the Regence Foundation grant to measure outcomes over a two-year period and create a primary palliative care guide for health care providers across the nation.

Darrell Owens, DNP, ARNP, director of the Palliative Care Service at Harborview and an attending provider, said the program puts UW Medicine "ahead of the curve in palliative care." He and his team currently see about 60 patients, providing continuity of care and keeping patients out of the emergency room when care can be managed by a primary care provider.

"As a community, we need to do more to ensure people with serious diseases have access to palliative care," said Michael Alexander, board chair of The Regence Foundation. "Just because a person didn't have good continuity of care earlier in life, it doesn't mean they shouldn't have it when they're facing a life-threatening disease. UW Medicine's model of combining palliative and primary care has a lot of potential for success because it combines disease management and the reduction of pain and suffering from disease symptoms."

Patients like Virginia Astrup, 90, are already benefitting from the program. Astrup, who lives in Seattle, was in hospice care, until she was dropped from that program because she essentially lived too long. Unable to see a primary-care provider, she became a regular at the emergency department for her heart-related ailments. Now, in this new program, Astrup lives independently at home, has regular visits with a nurse practitioner and only goes to the emergency department for a real emergency. She's happy, and wants others to know that they can have this type of end-of-life care, too. Primary and palliative care are combined and delivered by nurse practitioners trained in both specialties in this unique program. Patients have the option of visiting an outpatient clinic or—as in Virginia's case—they may receive a home or nursing facility visit by nurse practitioners. Patients also have around-the-clock telephone access to a nurse practitioner. Already, the program has demonstrated promise for improving the management of patients' pain and other symptoms, supporting patient compliance with treatment protocols, reducing the number of patient hospitalizations and emergency department visits, and strong family and caregiver satisfaction with care.
